VOCATION MINISTRY AND CONSECRATED LIFE CONFERENCE ROME, DECEMBER 1—3, 2017

This conference in Rome was attended by 800 Religious men and women from all over the world.

The conference opened with the reading of a letter from Pope Francis addressed to the attendees: https://zenit.org/articles/popes-message-to-vocational-conference/. He emphasized that Vocation Animation must be seen as leading to a personal encounter with Christ. It is important that all members of the church live their lives flowing from this encounter, in whatever vocation is chosen. All youth ministry goes hand in

hand with Vocation ministry. Prayer has to have an important place in our service to the Church; this implies that we are continually responding in gratitude for our own vocation call, and that we pray for those whom God is calling.

Pope Francis' emphasis on accompaniment of young people was echoed by most speakers. We n

was echoed by most speakers. We need to walk with them, listen to them, challenge them, invite them to give their lives to respond to the call of the Gospel. One speaker noted that Jesus has always been a source of fascination through generations, and for this reason, Religious Life will continue in some form. Young people need to be introduced to this "fascinating Jesus". He is the One for whom they are searching, although they may not know that.

In the call of the first disciples, when they wanted to know where Jesus lived, he said "Come and see". We heard that this is also the invitation that young people extend to us: Come and see my life, come and see my struggles, my fears, walk with me, listen to me, enter in and "spend the day" with me.

We heard ideas from various countries and cultures. All were trying, and some succeeding, to find creative ways to connect with young people. A couple of

communities have set up youth hostels so that when they leave home and move to a large city, there is a safe place to live, to share, to maintain family values. A couple of countries, one being the US, have a "year for Christ", in which they dedicate themselves to service and study.

These are paying off in terms of religious vocations. Some who are close to university campuses are opening their homes to students, inviting them to share meals and prayer on a regular basis, and some have students living with them.

From most speakers we heard about the need for a full-time vocation director and team to be involved with vocation animation.

Timothy Radcliffe, OP. He emphasized three needs for a congregation: 1. Strong identity. Religious life is a radical call and young people will be attracted to this. It goes against western culture of safety and comfort. Religious life should have some risk. 2. A strong theological understanding of the vows. Obedience is not infantile submission. It is a commitment to allow ourselves to be touched by our Sisters, to listen. Chastity is to love those who are different, open our hearts to them. Poverty, the

freedom to travel lightly; we don't even possess the idea of who we think we are. 3. **Strong Leadership**. We need creative leaders who are not afraid to take risks, and who are able to be calm in the midst of the storm, because, as he said, "Christ has died, is risen and will come again."

Since all this is part of the preparation for the Youth Synod in the fall of 2018, Cardinal Baldieri spoke of their efforts to reach out. The synod is hoping to hear from young people who are in the age range of

16 to 29, also non-Catholic and non-believers. There are common traits in youth around the world. They have been meeting with Bishops and youth ministers, encouraging as many as possible to take part in the on-line survey. They have had 380,856 "visits" to the website. Our prayers are essential for the success of the Synod.

It was a wonderful, encouraging opportunity to see the keen interest of so many communities in vocation animation.

LANDSCAPE OF RELIGIOUS VOCATIONS IN CANADA

Happy New Year from the team of the "Canadian Vocations to Religious Life" research project!

As we embark on the last stage of the research, we would like to express our gratitude to all the religious institutes that have contributed—and continue to do so — to the success of this project. We hope that the data collected through our research will create a platform for the development of a strategic plan for vocation animation across Canada.



We would also like to mention the *Conrad N. Hilton Foundation*, without whose financial support we would have not been able to undertake this project, and the *Centre for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA)*, our main research partner. These two organizations have been instrumental in the process, promoting through their commitment and support the future of vocation animation in North America.

Between January and March, we will conduct a series of site visits in collaboration with *CARA*. In these visits we will take a closer look into the congregational life of the institutes that continue to attract and retain larger-than-



the-average numbers of new members. If you think that your institute fits into this category and have not yet been contacted, please do not hesitate to get in touch with us.

A number of religious institutes have inquired about our research results. In addition to our concluding report, which we will send to our membership and other stakeholders, we will create a series of materials that will make the data accessible to the wider public. We will also be presenting the research results the "2018 National Association of Vocation & Formation Directors Conference", where we will meet with religious from across Canada, answer their questions, and collect their feedback.
